**표충사(表忠祠)** **Pyochungsa**

Monument No. 18  
 Jeollanam-do, Haeam-gun, Samnang-myeon, Guri-ri (1798)

This shrine was erected in the 10th year of Hyoenjong in the Joseon Dynasty to serve Rev. Seosam, who was expelled by the Japanese army for organizing monk soldiers during the first invasion by Japan. Rev. Seosam, who grew up as an orphan, became a monk and mastered the principle of Zen. When the Japanese army invaded Joseon in the 25th year of King Seonjo in the Joseon Dynasty (1522), he became a high military official, and rendered distinguished service to the county with Yu Jeong and Cheo Yeong by defeating the Japanese invaders. In the 12th year of King Jeongjo in Joseon (1788), the King endorsed the shrine with the nameplate titled "Pyochungsa," which was written by the King himself, and exempted the shrine from tax. The shrine has been improved to keep up with Seon Temple and Songwang Temple nearby through preservation efforts of the local government. Meanwhile, the relics of Rev. Seosam, such as his white clothes and a bowl, as well as gold foldings, are on exhibit.
